各位家長:

校長的話

2020-2021這個學年踏入了尾聲,本人在此衷心感謝家教會執委的貢獻,以及各位家長的參與!

在同學、家長和老師的共同努力下,本校2021年香港中學文憑考試之表現保持水準,四個主科 的成績如下:

考獲學士學位課程入學資格的學生達76.7%,比率遠高 於香港平均 (42.2%), 結果令人鼓舞。

中六戊班林妍佩同學考獲七科五級或以上的佳績; 而 中六甲班黃穎妍同學考獲六科五級或以上的卓越成績; 中 六甲班李令渝同學、中六戊班潘懿琳同學及郭穎蓁同學亦 同時考獲五科五級或以上的優秀成績。

除學術成績外,本校同學在其他領域亦屢獲佳績。祝 賀二零一九年中六畢業牛富家恩榮獲二零一九年至二零二 零年葛量洪傑出學生獎。雖然二零二零年至二零二一年之 結果仍未公佈,但本校學生已連續六屆獲此殊榮。葛量洪 傑出學生獎由各中學提名中六畢業生競逐,得獎者必須品 學兼優,積極參與課外活動,以及熱心為社區服務。

在香港遊樂場協會每兩年舉辦一次之香港傑出少年選 舉中,每次均從全港中小學選出共三十位得獎者。在芸芸 參賽者中,本校今年共有三位同學獲此殊榮。她們分別是 「個人奮進初級組」的中三乙班蔡悅思同學,「社會參與 組」的中四班陳婧妍同學及「個人成就高級組」的中五班 陳旼昕同學。在二零二一年香港傑出少年選舉中,有百份 之十的得獎者是本校同學。

在課外活動中,同學亦有優異的發揮及獲得不同的獎項。本校中四戊班羅譽馨同學為香港課外活動主任協會主辦香港課外活動優秀學生表揚計劃得獎者。中三甲班陳頌恩同學獲得匯盈國際音樂交流協會主辦之二零二零年匯盈全港中樂大賽(六級二胡組)金獎。中二乙班高葦頤同學獲得香港戶乓總會主辦之全港公開乒乓球單項錦標賽(女子丙組)亞軍。中三戊班孔璧然同學獲得屈臣氏集團主辦之香港學生運動員獎。

接下來,讓我們談談聖羅撒書院的一個傳統。在五月聖母月及十月玫瑰月的每個星期二及星期四,我們均會在校園聖母山前舉辦誦念玫瑰經祈禱活動。透過對聖母的尊敬,師生與聖母一同領悟和接受基督的救恩。各宗教科老師會在早會和課堂上鼓勵及邀請學生,參與誦念玫瑰經的行列。本校信仰小團體聖母軍、方濟少年及「主樂靈風」均會派出學生參與,為個人、家庭及社會送上祝福和禱告。在這飽受疫情肆虐的兩年,本校謹守防疫指引,只在教育局批准半天面授課堂的情況下,邀請一些有興趣的學生參與誦念玫瑰經祈禱活動。

我們都懷念在疫情出現之前的早上,約在7時40分開始,校園裡還没有太多人,師生一起圍著聖母山,風吹樹葉聲、外面駛過的車輛聲……我們一起低頭閉目祈禱,懷著同一的意向,懇求聖母為我們轉禱,好讓世人脫離疫症的折磨。這就是團體祈禱的力量,團體信仰賜給我們的那份感動,有異於個人祈禱,因為主說我們是同一的肢體。

我校的另一個傳統,就是於每年五月聖母月期間,在最後一個上學日的早上進行聖母加冕儀式。聖母瑪利亞深明人間疾苦,她是病人之痊及憂苦者之慰,我們確信因著聖母的轉求,讓世人勇敢面對生活中的一切困難和挑戰。去年的儀式從簡,改用直播方式進行,令全校師生能在課室內參與。今年的儀式則改用錄影方式播放,當我和領堅振的學生一起獻花,深深感受到聖母正是以女性溫柔的特質去服從主旨,跟隨耶穌。她提醒我們作為女性,學習她謹守家庭崗位,在信仰路上邁進。我把學校全體學生、教職員及工友交託於聖母媽媽手中,懇切祈求聖母的轉禱,祝願聖羅撒大家庭各人都健康、平安。在這兩年間,世界各地受著病毒的煎熬,飽受痛苦與焦慮,故此在結束禮儀前,全校師生一起誦念教宗撰寫的禱詞,懇求聖母在疫情危機中的庇佑和轉禱,陪伴我們早日脫離逆境。

香港青年協會於1月至2月訪問了2,790名12至24歲青年,當中47.7%人「感到孤獨」,58.8%人「覺得沒有人真正明白自己」,主要是「別人不明白我的處境」(72.3%);另有76.2%人認為經常有人願意聆聽是很重要;62.2%人較常以「影視娛樂」排解孤獨感。調查又以「一般健康量表」了解青年的精神健康狀況,發現48.9%人得分為13至24分,屬可界定為出現精神困擾。青協業務總監徐小曼稱,要戰勝孤獨感,在於能否感受到有意義的連結,例如找到可傾訴及依靠的對象。她建議我們多關心身邊的人,家人亦要多了解子女的生活,聆聽他們的心聲。





It is hard to realise how time flies when the memories of the first school day are still vivid. Although I can still recall the happiness during fun fairs and ECA days, sadly, it is already the time to say goodbye to my schoolmates. On the last day of school, I found out that it was not an easy job to write words of blessings to my classmates - cliched idioms like "all good things must come to an end" didn't seem to be suitable when writing to my close friends, while long-winded messages narrating flashbacks of memories weren't the best choice either.
